Dear Father Raleigh:

I hereby accept your resignation as Parish Priest of St. John the Baptist Parish at Milwaukie, the same to be effective November 5, 1946, and I hereby appoint you to be Parish Priest of St. John the Apostle at Oregon City, the appointment to become effective November 6, 1946, St. John the Apostle at Oregon City being vacant now by reason of the death of Father Sheridan.

Some time before the above-mentioned date, you will subscribe in my presence, or in the presence of a priest delegated by me, to the Profession of Faith, required by Canon 1443, §1, and to the Oath against Modernism, prescribed by Pope Pius X (1 September 1910, S.S.C.S.O., 22 March 1918).

I hereby dispense you from formal installation as Parish Priest at St. John the Apostle at Oregon City, and declare that you will have taken canonical possession when Father Manik turns over to you November 6 the keys of the Church and of the Tabernacle. You will, however, observe the provisions of Decree 150 of the Fourth Provincial Council of Portland in Oregon.

I pray that God will bless you abundantly in your new field of labor.

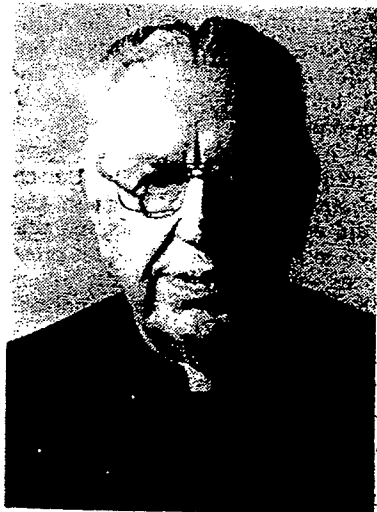

Fr. Raleigh To Note 40th Anniversary

SHERWOOD — Father Michael Raleigh will celebrate the 40th anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood Sunday, Sept. 26, at St. Francis Church here.

Mass will be at 11 a.m., follow-

ed by a reception until 3 p.m. in St. Francis Hall. A special celebration for the clergy will be held Wednesday, Sept. 29, in St. Francis Hall with a social hour beginning at 5 p.m. and dinner at 6 p.m.

Father Raleigh was ordained March 29, 1936, in Techy, Ill., at the Society of the Divine Word Seminary by Archbishop William O'Brien, president of the Extension Society.

Father Raleigh's first assignment in Oregon was as associate pastor of St. John the Baptist Parish, Milwaukie, in June, 1938. In August, 1939, he was named the associate pastor of St. Joseph Parish, Salem. In September, 1940, he was made pastor of St. Patrick Parish, Canby.

In January, 1943, Father Raleigh was placed in charge of Van-

port. In 1944 he was made pastor of St. John the Baptist Parish, Milwaukie and in November, 1946, pastor of St. John the Apostle Parish, Oregon City.

He was later assigned to Via Coeli, Jemez Springs, N.M., and later became pastor in charge of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish, Rainier. In August, 1956, he was named pastor of St. Augustine Parish, Lincoln City. In August, 1957, pastor of St. Joseph Parish, Portland.

Since then his assignments have included chaplain at St. Vincent Hospital, Portland; administrator of St. Francis of Assisi Parish, Portland; associate pastor of St. Monica Parish, Coos Bay; chaplain at Christie School, Maryhurst, and St. Catherine Nursing Home, North Bend.

Father Raleigh Dies Unexpectedly April 12

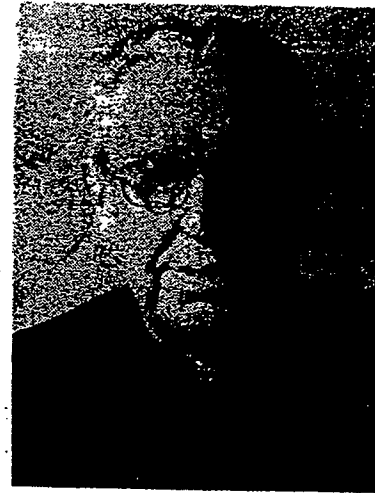
Concelebrated Mass of Christian Burial was offered April 17 at St. Mary Cathedral, Portland, for Father Michael Raleigh, who died unexpectedly April 12 after entering a Portland hospital for scheduled abdominal surgery on April 13. Interment was at Mt. Calvary Cemetery.

Father Raleigh was born May 27, 1902, at Chicago. He attended St. Mary of the Lake Seminary at Mundelein, Ill., and St. Meinrad Seminary. He was ordained for the Archdiocese of Portland March 29, 1936.

Following his ordination he was associate pastor at St. John the Baptist Parish, Milwaukie from 1936-39, and at St. Joseph Parish, Salem, from 1939-40, when he received his first pastorate at St. Patrick Parish, Canby. In 1943 he was named administrator of St. Catherine of Siena Parish at Vanport. In 1944 he returned to St. John Parish, Milwaukie, as pastor.

In 1946, he was named pastor at St. John the Apostle Parish, Oregon City. From 1951-56 he was on leave of absence, returning to become administrator at Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish, Rainier. Later that year he became administrator of St. Augustine Parish, Lincoln City. From 1958-59 he was administrator at St. Therese Parish, Portland, and from 1959-62 was administrator at St. Francis Parish, Portland.

From 1962-63 he was chaplain at

St. Vincent Hospital, Portland, and 1963-64 was chaplain at Christie Home at Marylhurst. In 1964 he returned to parish work and was pastor 1964-65 at St. Anthony Parish, Waldport. From 1965-68 he was administrator at St. Mary Parish, Florence, and served from 1968-72 as chaplain at St. Catherine Nursing Home, North Bend. He retired June 1, 1972, and became chaplain at Dammasch Hospital, Wilsonville, until retiring from that position in August, 1975. Following his retirement, he continued to assist in parishes with daily and weekend schedules.

Surviving are sisters Mary Dwyer and Terese Raleigh, both of Chicago.
