As you prepare to enter into our Chemical Dependency Unit, we want to inform you about our procedurés. This checklist will assist you in packing and making your travel arrangements. There are some items we want you to bring and other supplies and procedures to review. In order to provide safety you and your peers in our treatment process, we ask that you NOT BRING CERTAIN ITEMS. Hopefully, the following checklist will aid you in you preparations. 🔻

We anticipate your arrival. We want you to know that we are here to provide a safe therapeutic environment for you to work on your issues. On program/process is based on the 12 Steps and Traditions. RECOVERY BEGIN WITH THE FIRST STEP. We promise to walk with you on your unique journey in recovery.

CHECKLIST:

Clothing: À.

- Bring sport shoes (i.e., Lennis, hiking, running)
- Bring casual clothes (i.e., jeans, slacks, sweatship 2. sweaters, jackets, shorts (no sexually provocative close permitted, such as: short-shorts, tights, half tanktops, or spandex)). Sweatsuits for workouts.

Do not bring any tee-shirts with slogans, symbols, or saying

- Bring a swimming suit (again no provocative bikini types french cut suits).
- Bring a raincoat or jacket (it usually rains in the afternoon in New Mexico, especially in the Spring).

B. Supplies Needed:

- 1. Bring plastic bottles for toiletries (shampoo, liquid soaps tampons/pads, etc.). No glass containers.
- 2. No liquids that contain alcohol.
- 3. You may bring an alarm clock (no radio attachments).
- 4. Bring some quarters for washers and dryers (no bleach is allowed, washing soap and softeners are provided). Irons are available.
- 5. Bring addresses, phone numbers of significant persons you make want to invite to your FAMILY PROGRAM (usually 4-5 persons include home and business phone numbers. Also bring the numbers of your EAP's and/or therapist.

C. Please DO NOT BRING The Following Items:

- Radios, tape recorders, tapes, novels, or other bear Cottonwood will furnish you with books, tapes, and recorder etc. as therapeutically needed.
- 2. You may bring Bibles other Holy Books However, therapist will issue your Holy Books by after therapeutic needs have been assessed (initially, books be stored in your suitcase).
- No pointed objects (tweezers, fingerna pers, ft etc). Do not bring nail polish. Some of your manicure need will be met. Our medical unit has géneral equipment.
- No craft materials (knitting needles, sewing materials);
 hobbies.
- No musical instruments, cameras, sports equipment.
- 6. You are welcome to bring all prescriptions and over-the counter medications which you are currently taking. This includes anti-depressants, sleeping pills, valuables homeopahic medications, allergy remedies, laxatives, etc. the our facility licensure, we must monitor, dispense and prescribe all medications given to you during your treatment stay.
- 7. No food or beverages including teas, coffees, herbal drinks, etc.

- No mirrors (bedrooms have mirrors).
- 9. No perfumes, aftershave lotions, colognes, etc.
- 10. No razors (safety or straight). Electric razors are permissable after staff inspection. (Disposable razors are provided by the facility.

D. Other Chemical Dependency Unit Procedures:

- Chemical Dependency Unit treatment is usually 30 days. You will exit Cottonwood on Day 31, after 12 noon. All travel arrangements need to consider the exit on Day 31.
- 2. There are no single rooms. All Chemical Dependency Unit patients room with 3-5 peers in a large bedroom space. All rooms contain 1-2 showers, toilet, and adequate closet and dressing space.
- You may neither receive, nor make phone calls during the TEN DAYS OF TREATMENT. Clients admitted before Friday receive visitors and make phone calls between 1p.m. and the SECOND SUNDAY of their stay. Limit all incoming outgoing calls to 10 minutes.
- 4. Essential personal contems can be purchased for shops for clients on ays and Fridays). The following can be purchased; shamooo, toothpaste tuctnbrotampons/pads, hairspray (non-aerosol only), locons (allow free only), deodorants, shaving creams, sugar's sum.

F. <u>Medical:</u>

A personal search will be conducted by medical personne' apparation. Treatment staff will do a luggage search.

Medications:

It is required that you surrender ownership of all medications will be evaluated you are admitted. All medications will be evaluated individual basis and you will be involved in this process welcome to bring supportive documentation including letters your physician and their phone numbers. In the event medications are deemed inappropriate and unnecessary, they will discontinued. Medications that are deemed inappropriate and unnecessary will not be returned to you upon discharge.

As per your letter of January 27, 1994, please know that I am in total support of Father Baccellieri's gradual return to a full and active ministry. There is no reason why he cannot begin weekend work as soon as the need arises.

The plans you outlined for his return to a parish in July are also ones I support.

Father Baccellieri and I have agreed on the following conditions:

No long-term counseling with either adolescents or adults. This does not prevent him from working with groups of people, however, such as marriage encounters or marriage preparation work. My concern would be those counseling sessions with individuals that would lead to ongoing contact.

Father Baccellieri has also agreed to continue his individual therapy on a weekly basis with me, as well as participation in weekly group therapy, along with ongoing 12-Step work.

I believe all of the requirements have been fulfilled to permit Father Baccellieri to return to some restricted pastoral ministry. I have enclosed a letter sent by Tom Dulcich informing Mr. s attorney of our intent to reassign Father Baccellieri.

Dr. Eskeli is in agreement with our basic plan for Father Baccellieri - that he will begin by doing supply work on weekends or other specific occasions in parishes. In July he would be assigned as a parochial vicar in a parish. He will continue living at the Austin House. Dr. Eskeli also sees no problem in Father Baccellieri assisting with Marriage Encounters on a periodic basis.

The following conditions need to be followed by Father Baccellieri.

- 1) He must continue therapy with Dr. Eskeli.
- 2) He must continue participating in therapy or 12 step groups at the direction of Dr. Eskeli.
- 3) He should continue living at Austin House for the sake of support and accountability during those times when he is not working.
